County probate courts determine the need for substituted judgement due to mental impairment. Our trained, qualified legal guardians take on full decision-making responsibilities for individuals in need due to severe mental illness, or other debilitating diagnoses.



THIS WEEK'S MEMBER PROFILE

Bob was born in Ashland, Ohio and had two siblings Myra, who passed away in 2017, and Doug who lives in New Smyrna Beach in Florida. He attended Ashland High School. He graduated from Ashland College with a major in Business Management. Della was born in Galion, Ohio and attended Ibera High School. She received her three year nursing certificates from Mansfield General Hospital School of Nursing. She had three siblings Phylis, who passed away in 2010, Flora who passed in 2014 and Doris who lives in Galion, Ohio

Today's story is about a loving couple that met at a dance sponsored by the Mansfield Ohio School of Nursing. Della was training to be a nurse at the time. Bob and Della got married after Bob graduated from Ashland College in 1963. Bob turned out to be a job hopper. His first job was as a Production Planner at Westinghouse in Mansfield where their son Steve was born. They moved to Canton where Bob worked at Diebolt. Their son David was born in Canton. The next move was back to Mansfield Ohio, then to Danville, IL to work as a Materials Manager at Bohn Heat Transfer. He finally ended up in Cincinnati, Ohio as a Materials Manager for Keichler Mfg. During these moves Della worked at various hospitals in town and on her undergraduate degree in Nursing , and in 1996 she graduated from the University of Cincinnati.

They were married in the Lutheran church in Galion, Ohio and have raised two sons, Steve age 60 and David age 59. Steve just retired as the Executive Director for the National Center for Appropriate Technology in Butte, Mt. Dave is an Electrical Engineer for Goodyear in Akron. They had two grandchildren, Sam and Oliver. Sam died in August 2023. She was twenty nine years old. Oliver is nineteen years old and is enrolled in Akron University. Della died on June 28, 2023 at Ames Family Hospice House in Westlake. She had battled with Alzheimer's Disease for several years but the disease finally won. Bob knows she is in a much better place.

Della and Bob joined POP in 2001. They had moved to Westlake from Cincinnati and were looking for a home church. Della was a Lutheran from birth and converted Bob. They checked out several Lutheran Churches in the area but chose POP because of Pastor Bishop and his sermons.

Bob has been involved with many groups at POP. His activities include Habitat for Humanity, Church Council, preparing meals at 2100 Lakeside as part of Lutheran Metropolitan Ministries Men's Shelter. Travel Quest and Young at Heart also provide a great connection. His hobbies include growing plants from seeds in his second bedroom, line dancing, square dancing, volunteering as a Red Coat at Playhouse Square and joining hikes with the Cleveland Hiking Club.

Something that people may not know is in 1987 thru 1989 Della and Bob were in the Peace Corps in St. Lucia. Bob was facing a midlife crisis at 48 years old and needed a change. Steve was working out west and David was in the Navy. Their dog of 11 years had passed away and Bob was very dissatisfied with the company he worked at. Bob said it was a great experience. Living two years in a different culture gave him and Della an understanding that even if the culture is different America isn't the only country with nice people.

I enjoy any time I meet Bob, he has a contagious enthusiasm and is always in a positive frame of mind. He is always ready to join in and help in all his endeavors. While serving at the traditional service, you can tell that our Lord has blessed him, and he is happy to praise our Savior!

Psalm 42

Longing for God and His Help in Distress To the leader. A Maskil of the Korahites. 1 As a deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God. 2 My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and behold the face of God? 3 My tears have been my food day and night, while people say to me continually, "Where is your God?" 4 These things I remember, as I pour out my soul: how I went with the throng, and led them in procession to the house of God, with glad shouts and songs of thanksgiving, a multitude keeping festival. 5 Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my help 6 and my God. My soul is cast down within me; therefore I remember you from the land of Jordan and of Hermon. from Mount Mizar. 7 Deep calls to deep at the thunder of your cataracts; all your waves and your billows have gone over me. 8 By day the Lord commands his steadfast love, and at night his song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life. 9 I say to God, my rock, "Why have you forgotten me? Why must I walk about mournfully because the enemy oppresses me?" 10 As with a deadly wound in my body, my adversaries taunt me, while they say to me continually, "Where is your God?" 11 Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my help and my God.

When we gather for our weekly staff meeting, we begin with a time of sharing. We each take a moment to share the highs and lows from the past week and where we have seen the hand of God in these past few days. Some of you may do this as part of your daily devotion with your family members as well.

I ask you to take a moment and reflect on where you have seen God active in the past few days in your life. Where do you see God in the beauty of creation? How have you seen God's love demonstrated by others? What has been a blessing to you for which you are thankful, knowing that God is the giver of all that is good?

Sometimes it seems as if God is hidden from sight, and the words of this psalm echo what is on our hearts – as the deer longs for streams of water, so my soul longs for you, O God.

I appreciate these words, for there is assurance in knowing that when my soul needs to be quenched and God seems far away, I am not alone in that wilderness. I am also assured that God has NOT abandoned me, even when I am longing for more.

Take some time to read the words of this psalm again. Do they speak to where you are today?

Then take some time to search, even when it may be difficult to see, where God is and what God is up to in your life today.

I love the words that end this psalm today –

Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my help and my God.

Be assured that God is with us. God is with you. God is always ready to hear our words of thankfulness and praise. And God is always ready to hear the times of uncertainty, longing and doubt, when our souls are thirsting and need quenched.

God is with us. God is with you.

Matthew 28:20 – Jesus said, "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Let us pray: Thank you, God for all you have given. Be with me in the times my soul needs to be quenched. Remind me again and again that you are with me, and will never let me go. We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen.
