


10 Days In the Holy Land

Prince of Peace Ministry of the Month

Every month, Prince of Peace will feature one of our engagement ministries. We will share information about the ministry and let you know how you can get involved. For the month of August, the ministry to be lifted up is the OMNI Student Sponsorship Program.

OMNI Student Sponsorship Program

The OMNI school currently has 352 students in grades 1 - 9. Approximately 173 of these students are not sponsored. While a portion of our students are orphans living with family members other than their parents, all students are considered vulnerable and living in absolute poverty.

Will you become a sponsor? This can be done in two simple steps.

1. Complete the sponsor form on line at www.omnimissions.com or they were be available after the first week of August at church.

2. Set up your monthly payments online or via check. The cost of sponsorship is \$35.00 per month or \$420.00 for the year. Checks can be mailed to OMNI at PO Box 670, Hertford, NC 27944

What do the students receive from their sponsors? They continue to receive a quality education at the OMNI school at George Compound, uniforms, shoes, school supplies, a daily hot meal prepared in the newly renovated kitchen, clean drinking water and medical care - all in an atmosphere of Christian love. Your sponsorship fee is applied directly to meet these needs.

Each year at the "Bluz Over Africa" concert, a specific need is identified for the students. In the past we have provided them with new sweaters, shoes, two mosquito nets, a meal for a month for the student and their family and have equipped new science labs which were added to the school when they increased from grade 7 to grade 9.

Sponsors are encouraged to write notes to their student which Karen Throckmorton, president of OMNI delivers when she goes to Zambia. The students are also encouraged to write to their sponsors. Occasionally, small gifts such as coloring books, colored pencils, socks, underwear, and hair clips have been sent. With Covid, this has been limited because the OMNI staff in the US have not been able to travel to Zambia. Gifts are sent to Karen for mailing and delivery. Extra money can be given for special occasions such as Christmas to provide a meal for the family.

Student Sponsorship Testimonial

I first became a sponsor after my mission trip to Africa in 2015. Her name is Esther and at the time she was in grade 3. She is now in grade 9. After seeing all the children at the OMNI school, it was impossible not to want to become a sponsor. When I went back in 2017, I was able to meet Esther and spend some time with her. What a special treat that was for me! In 2019, I became a co-sponsor with Bev Braun of Blessings. At that time, she was in grade 4. I have enjoyed getting all the letters, pictures and drawings from both girls. ~Judy Kazak
