

Chicago —The 2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly met Aug. 8-12 at the Greater Columbus Convention Center in Columbus, Ohio. Gathering under the theme "Embody the Word," the assembly worshiped together in services of eucharist and lament, experienced a liturgy rooted in Indigenous traditions, and heard a public apology in a nonlegislative session to Iglesia Luterana Santa María Peregrina for harm experienced from actions taken by the Sierra Pacific Synod and this church. ## **Orphan Medical Network International**



Since its founding in 1989, OMNI has focused on medical care for vulnerable children around the world. OMNI's mission has taken them to Russia, South Korea, and now Zambia.

The infectious passion of co-founder Karen Rae Throckmorton has now spread to many who participate in OMNI's mission around the world. Since 2001, OMNI has had a major influence on the care of vulnerable children in the Copperbelt Province of northern Zambia. Medical teams consisting of physicians, nurses and support staff have made several trips to that area. The effort began with mobile medical clinics and has grown into the building and staffing and most recently the opening of schools supported by OMNI. After several trips to Zambia to experience the needs, OMNI's mission has been refocused to a more holistic approach. OMNI's foundation in providing health care for children remains a strong commitment. However, the mission has grown to to serve vulnerable children and the communities in which they live through education and community development.

Our Mission is to provide components for sustainability and hope in the lives of vulnerable children and their communities in Zambia, Africa.

Our Vision is to improve the health, education, and general well-being of vulnerable communities through medical care, education, and community support in an atmosphere of Christian faith and hope that is respectful to indigenous cultures.

#### A video on Anderson Mambwe

Anderson came to the church before and after his operation to share his story.

Anderson Mambwe is a young man from Zambia who, as a teenager, was battling incredible bilateral foot deformities and was sent to OMNI for assistance. OMNI got a medical visa for him, transported him to the US, connected with an amazing foot surgeon in Roanoke, VA, had the hospital wave the astronomical surgical fees, and he recovered well.



Since then, he has attended medical school and is a productive young man in his country.

Anderson needs two more surgeries on his feet, but the orthopedic specialists in Zambia are unable to help.

Dr. Zelen in Roanoke, who did his surgery several years ago, has agreed to pay for his flight, write a letter of need for the medical visa, do the surgical repairs once again with no charge (these were 8 hours surgeries with partial amputations) and seek a waiver for the hospital costs.

Currently, there are no medical or business trips to Zambia planned, so the best ways to help the mission are:

- Sponsor a student at the OMNI school
- Make a donation to OMNI

\$10 feeds an entire family for 1 week

\$25 purchases a uniform for one student

\$50 affords enough treated mosquito nets for the family and students
