COVID Directions – August 2021 Update

Dear Members and Friends of Prince of Peace:

The news is always changing, isn't it? We have been dealing with COVID issues for nearly 18 months, and sometimes it feels like we take two steps forward and another one back.

Even though guidelines and information continue to change, our two guiding principles at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church remain the same:

- 1. To proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ in Word and Sacrament, carrying out God's mission as God leads.
- 2. To be mindful of the health and safety of all.

First of all, we offer these words of thanks.

- THANK YOU to all have been vaccinated. This is our best line of defense in addressing the virus.
- THANK YOU to all you parents who are making sure your kids are wearing masks, to keep them safe and healthy. Well done.
- THANK YOU to all of you who are wearing masks, vaccinated or not, out of care and concern for your neighbor and yourself.
- THANK YOU to those who join us for our live streaming services either out of necessity or choice. You are a part of our worshipping family, and we are thankful for the resources to share the good news those outside of the bricks and mortar of our buildings.

We cannot tell you what to do. We will not turn people away at the door. ALL are welcome. That being said, we would encourage the following:

- If you are able to do so, get vaccinated. We ask that all our volunteers and staff are vaccinated to ensure their health and well-being as well as those they serve. We encourage you to do the same.
- We strongly encourage children to be masked, as well as all who come in contact with them in the church building.
- Masks are recommended for the times we gather in close quarters with each other. That includes the sanctuary.
- Communion will continue to be offered at the altar by Pastor Charlie and a communion assistant, both who are fully vaccinated. We will both be masked as you come forward. We will continue to offer individual prepackaged cups for those who wish to commune using these.
- Musicians and singers will be located away from the congregation and will be masked we will ask that the chairs be reserved only for the singers and band members at the 9 am service, while those gathered for worship sit in the pews.
- For groups meeting at the church, we encourage masks if any of those gathered are not vaccinated.

Please know this is one step forward. As other changes are possible, we will share them with you. As we move forward, let us remember that the concern is not just for ourselves, but for our neighbor as well.

The Need for God

We have gone through many named generations in my time here on earth. I am actually too old to be included in the post world-war II Baby Boomer Generation which went from 1946 to 1964. Then came the Generation X group that was from 1965 to 1976. The Millennial Generation followed from 1977 to 1995. Then the Gen Z group sometimes called the iGen or the Centennnials who were born from 1996 to 2015. Now it's the Generation Alpha. Different sources give somewhat different date ranges, and I was aware of all these names except the current Generation Alpha.



1901 to 1927 was called the Greatest Generation. and I caught the tail end of the Silent Generation of those born from 1926 to 1945. Much has been written about each generation of Americans, but this is a story about the faith of these generations. Starting with the Generation X'ers in the sixties, church attendance started to decline. It had a lot to do with materialism. This concept of has been around for a long time. But its emergence as a world view espoused no need for God. This world view, with its foundation of absolute freedom and the concept of everyone having the right to do what they want as long as it doesn't harm others, has continued through the succeeding generations to today.

Douglas Copeland defined Generation X, including himself, as folks who wandered in the wilderness of life without God. But surprisingly at the end of one of his books he writes a post script as follows: "Now here is my secret: I tell you with an openness of heart that I doubt I shall ever achieve again, so I pray that you are in a quiet room as you hear these words. My secret is that I need God, that I am sick and can no longer make it alone. I need God to help me give, because I no longer seem capable of giving; to help me be kind, as I no longer seem capable of kindness; to help me love, as I seem beyond being able to love."

Many who wander in this wilderness without God may never find meaning in their lives. Those whose honest search for purpose and meaning in their lives can and do find what is truly important with the help of the Lord. There is some indication today that folks are searching for answers that can only be found in the Christian Bible. Helping to build a personal relationship with the Lord is a focus for Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, where we can Grow in Faith, Serve the Lord and Live in Peace. How will you grow, serve and live with the help of God?
