




SOAP Bible Study

Peace Pavilion – The Time is Now

Dear Prince of Peace Members.

THANK YOU!!! We were humbled to have such a great turnout to the Special Congregational Meeting last Sunday, to have an opportunity to answer very thoughtful questions from you, and to receive the unanimous approval to proceed with the construction of the Peace Pavilion and our bridge financing plan. We now shift our attention to construction while continuing our fundraising efforts.

On construction, you should expect to see progress begin this month. We plan to prepare the site for construction with tree removal and excavation this month. In late May / early June we expect to pour concrete. By the end of June, we hope to see the structure begin to take form with masonry work underway and steel beams arriving. Our goal is to complete the core construction of the pavilion by the end of August. Groundbreaking will take place on Sunday, May 19th at 10:15 a.m. Details forthcoming. We are very excited to begin to see progress!

Our fundraising efforts will continue as we shared on Sunday. We have now reached 82% committed giving for the construction cost. In addition, our Worship and Music Committee has generously approved funding for outdoor audio/visual equipment thanks to the Ilene Hardy Memorial Fund. In the coming weeks, we will communicate additional contribution opportunities such as for benches.

This is an exciting time for Prince of Peace and all of us. We will continue to communicate opportunities for engagement as well as plans for programming aligned to our Mission.


GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY!



Tending the Flock of God

5 Now as an elder myself and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as one who shares in the glory to be revealed, I exhort the elders among you 2 to tend the flock of God that is in your charge, exercising the oversight, not under compulsion but willingly, as God would have you do it—not for sordid gain but eagerly. 3 Do not lord it over those in your charge, but be examples to the flock. 4 And when the chief shepherd appears, you will win the crown of glory that never fades away. 5 In the same way, you who are younger must accept the authority of the elders. And all of you must clothe yourselves with humility in your dealings with one another, for

"God opposes the proud,

but gives grace to the humble."

Christ is Risen!

He is Risen. Indeed! Alleluia!

Today's passage comes from Peter's letter to the churches scattered across the region. Here is the old disciple passing on words of knowledge that he has gained over the years, as well as encouragement to those who follow in his footsteps. Peter can offer these words because he has experience in these areas. Two lessons that I lift up today in this passage are humility and shepherding.

Peter can share a word or two about humility because he knows what it is like to be humbled! Peter could have written a book in his early years of following Jesus entitled, "Great Humility and How I Achieved It!" Peter is seen in the Gospels as the disciple who didn't know when to keep his mouth shut.

- Peter forbids Jesus from talking about the path to suffering and death on the cross, and receives a rebuke from Jesus in the harsh words, 'Get behind me. Satan!"
- Peter offers to build three booths for Jesus, Moses and Elijah on the Mount of Transfiguration, and his plan is overshadowed by a cloud and the voice of God, who tells Peter and his fellow disciples who Jesus is ("This is my Son, the Beloved") and what they ought to do ("Listen to Him!")
- Peter speaks brave words the night Jesus is betrayed, saying to Jesus "Lord, I am ready to go with you to prison and to death!" Jesus responded, "I tell you, Peter, the cock will not crow this day, until you have denied three times that you know me." Jesus words foreshadow the events that play out later that night and into Good Friday.

Peter can share words of humility because he knows what it is like to be humbled. Peter knows it isn't about how great Peter is, but about how great God is!

Peter can also speak these words because he knows what it is like to be forgiven, and given another chance.

There is a beautiful story at the end of the Gospel of John (chapter 21) where Jesus feeds Peter and his fellow disciples breakfast on the seashore. Here, Jesus asks Peter three times, "Do you love me?" Three times. One for each denial?

Peter responds, "Yes Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus commands each time – feed my sheep. Feed my sheep. Tend my flock. Care for those entrusted to me. And now, Peter passes on the words to the church. That's you and me.

How many times have we needed to knocked down off our "how great I am" pedestals?

How many times have we denied knowing Jesus?

How many times have we been welcomed back into God's loving embrace?

In response, let us love one another, feed one another, tend to the needs of each other.

In doing so, we say thank you to God.

Thank you, Peter, for letting us know that God gives us another chance today.

Christ is Risen. Risen Indeed - ALLELUIA and AMEN!

Let us pray:

Almighty God, thank you for knocking us down when we get too high on ourselves. Thank you for lifting us up when we hit the bottom. Use us as your fellow workers in your vineyard to care for all of your creation, made in Your image. We pray this in the name of the Good Shepherd lesus Christ, our Risen Savior. Amen.


