

Exodus 20:1-17

The Ten Commandments

Then God spoke all these words:

2 I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; 3 you shall have no other gods before me.

4 You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. 5 You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, punishing children for the iniquity of parents, to the third and the fourth generation of those who reject me, 6 but showing steadfast love to the thousandth generation of those who love me and keep my commandments.

7 You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God, for the Lord will not acquit anyone who misuses his name.

8 Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. 9 Six days you shall labor and do all your work. 10 But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work—you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns. 11 For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the Lord blessed the sabbath day and consecrated it.

12 Honor your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you.

13 You shall not murder.

14 You shall not commit adultery.

15 You shall not steal.

16 You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

17 You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or male or female slave, or ox, or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

Here is a pet peeve of mine. It frustrates me that almost every place I see these ten commandments listed, the list begins at verse 3. I believe the commandments take on a completely different tone if verses 1 and 2 are missing.

Verse 1 – God spoke. These words come from God.

Verse 2 – God reminds God's people of who God is and what God has done. I am the Lord your God. I have brought you out of slavery.

BECAUSE of what God has done, God then says, THEREFORE, live by these commands.

Before the commands, the relationship is established. Before the commands, God acts. Before the commands, we are already those who belong to God.

These commands, which focus first on our relationship with God, then on our relationship with others, are given to us to guide us in living as God created us – to love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, strength and mind, and to love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commands, Jesus said, hang all the law and all the prophets.

Because God loved us (AND LOVES us), we are commanded to love. Because God forgave us (AND FORGIVES us), we are commanded to forgive.

It all begins with God. Not with "thou shalt not..."

Remember all that God has done for you. In response, is not God worthy of our thanks and praise?

Remember what God has done for you in giving us the greatest gift of all in Jesus Christ. Because of Jesus Christ, we are forgiven and set free from the bondage of sin and death. In response, let us love one another.

Let us pray: Almighty God, thank you for all you have done and continue to do to show us how much you love us. May we follow in your way, and walk on the path you set before us. We pray this in Jesus name, Amen.


