

Prayer Wall

If you ever make it to Jerusalem, a must-see site is the Western or Wailing Wall. The wall has stood for over 2000 years. The wall surrounded the Temple in Jesus' day. The Temple was the place where God dwelt. Seated on the Ark of the Covenant, the Temple was the place God resided. It is the closest that the Jewish community comes to the former Temple site.



Pilgrims from around the world come to the wall to pray. These old stones show their age, with many nooks and crevices from a couple

inches to several feet in size. These pilgrims often will bring written prayers and place them in crevices as an offering to God.

When we were visiting our exchange student in Germany, we visited his family's church Inside the doors, there was a table set up with bricks – a prayer wall for the church. I brought that idea home to us at Prince of Peace for Lent.

In the narthex, a table with a brick wall will greet you at the entrance of the sanctuary. Pieces of paper and pens will be there for you. Take time to write a prayer – joys and sorrows. At the end of Lent, we will take all these prayers and burn them in our fire pit outside – an offering to God. Pr. Charlie





Tug-of-War

We live in a troubled world. I don't think anyone will argue with that statement. In my 75 plus years I can not think of a time when we, as a society, have moved farther from our Christian goals and ideals.



There is a constant tug-of-war between good and evil, and when we stand down, evil fills in. Most all the problems we see in society today are because we have drifted away, and evil has filled in and grabbed ahold. Problems in our schools, problems of crime, problems with our drifting morals, problems of divisiveness, and on and on.

A friend in Tucson told me that over 78% of the population of greater Tucson believes in God. But only about 9% attend a church of any kind. We, as a society, just aren't active Christians any more. We have backed off and are standing down. We are part of the problem! He sited facts that show that there are tipping points. When just 10% of the population believes and is vocal about some issue, it can and does tip the 90% to follow. The fight to take God and Jesus out of the public schools had been building for over 50 years, and it has now tipped, and we, the passive 90%, now accept it as the norm.

And when you ask most people, Christians included, "Are there problems?" The answer is overwhelmingly. "Yes." But most people do not want to get involved, they do not want to make a commitment to fix the problems. Several years before he left office, former Cleveland Mayor Frank Jackson was addressing the many growing problems facing the city. He stated, 'We know what the problems are. We have known what the problems are for some time now. We just haven't done anything about them."

I believe that a return to our Christian goals and guidelines is the answer. And, I believe that a return to God's church is the start of the fix. Remember that the church is Jesus' bride. The next step is active, not passive, involvement in learning more about becoming the Christians that God wants us to be, then being active in living our lives for Jesus. Our church, Prince of Peace Lutheran Church has many wonderful society supportive missions and activities that need your active engagement and financial support.

February 2022 Health and Safety Update

The Health and Safety Team met on February 26 to discuss the latest information from the CDC and reviewed our guiding principles.

On February 25, the CDC revised its guidelines regarding mask recommendations. Instead of basing mask recommendations solely on caseload, the guidance also will consider hospitalizations, current beds by COVID patients and hospital capacity.

In the past couple of weeks, the caseload and hospitalization numbers in our community have greatly improved, and based on this new guidance from CDC, our county and surrounding counties are communities where the CDC suggests masks be optional for gatherings.

Our two guiding principles at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church remain the same:

- 1. To proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ in Word and Sacrament, carrying out God's mission as God leads.
- 2. To be mindful of the health and safety of all.

Based on these factors, we are changing our congregational protocols to be "mask optional", effective immediately. Those who wish to remove their masks in the church, classes, meetings, and gatherings may do so; those who wish to keep them on may also do so. We have a wide range of risk tolerance and health needs in the congregation, and our aim is to provide as many options for people to participate as we can, both in person and virtually.

High priority ministries that include individuals who may have increased risk will continue to be supported by wearing masks. Communion servers and the pastor will wear masks during the distribution; nursery volunteers will wear masks.

We encourage the following:

- If you are sick, please stay home. Whether you suspect a cold or flu, COVID or something else, and you show symptoms, please stay home and work on getting well!
- If you test positive for COVID-19, please let us know. As members of the church family, we want to offer any support we can. As with any health information, we will keep your information confidential.
- If you were exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19, please consider wearing a mask to protect the possible spread to others.
- Be considerate of those who continue to wear masks. There are many reasons why masks are still the best option for many in our community.
- In all these things, we love one another through these challenging days!

Remember that worship is live streamed every Sunday at 9 am and 11 am on our YouTube Page, so that everyone can join in worship!

The pandemic has tested our patience and resilience, and we appreciate the ways in which the people, leadership, and staff of Prince of Peace have supported each other through the past two years.
