

Beginning on Wednesday, March 1st, we will gather for Soup and Study at noon in the Fellowship Hall through the season of Lent.


The video series "The Way" by Adam Hamilton will be our study focus for Lent. Pastor Charlie Woodward will lead the discussions.



If you ever make it to Jerusalem, a must-see site is the Western or Wailing Wall. The wall has stood for over 2000 years. The wall surrounded the Temple in Jesus' day. The Temple was the place where God dwelt. Seated on the Ark of the Covenant, the Temple was the place God resided. It is the closest that the Jewish community comes to the former Temple site.

Pilgrims from around the world come to the wall to pray. These old stones show their age, with many nooks and crevices from a couple

inches to several feet in size. These pilgrims often will bring written prayers and place them in crevices as an offering to God.



In the narthex, a table with a brick wall will greet you at the entrance of the sanctuary. Pieces of paper and pens will be there for you. Take time to write a prayer – joys and sorrows. At the end of Lent, we will take all these prayers and burn them in our fire pit outside – an offering to God. Pr. Charlie

From PC's PC (Pastor Charlie's Personal Computer!)

First Reading: Joel 2:1-2, 12-17 1Blow the trumpet in Zion; sound the alarm on my holy mountain! Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble, for the day of the Lord is coming, it is near—2a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness! Like blackness spread upon the mountains a great and powerful army comes; their like has never been from of old, nor will be again after them in ages to come.
12Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning;
13rend your hearts and not your clothing.
Return to the Lord, your God,
for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing. 14Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the Lord, your God? 15Blow the trumpet in Zion; sanctify a fast; call a solemn assembly; 16gather the people. Sanctify the congregation; assemble the aged; gather the children, even infants at the breast. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her canopy. 17Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the Lord, weep. Let them say, "Spare your people, O Lord, and do not make your heritage a mockery, a byword among the nations. Why should it be said among the peoples,



Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Later in our worship tonight service will be a sign placed on our brows, a reminder that we are all dust, and we will return to dust. It is only through the life that God has breathed into us that we have life. It is only by God's grace that we have life, and all that comes with it.

Back in August of 2008, my family and I gathered in the church in which we grew up – First Congregational Church of Royal Oak. We gathered with friends and family, some whom we hadn't seen in decades, to remember my Dad, his 84 years of life, love and companionship. When the service in the church was over, my oldest brother, Rich, took the box that held my Father's remains, and led the family and those gathered out to the memorial garden just outside the church. There the minister shared more words of comfort and promise. We commended Dad to God's care. My brother then opened the box and gathered a handful of the ashes, as did his wife and children, and scattered them on the flowerbed. My brothers and I, together with our families did the same. Then others came forward, lifting the fine, grey ash from the container and spreading it into the ground – earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust. It was a meaningful, powerful moment for me.

'Where is their God?' "



#### Continued:

In June of 2012, just four years later, we gathered at the same church for our mother's funeral. Once again, we spread the ashes on the ground – earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust.

Since those occasions, Ash Wednesday has never been the same for me. The ashes placed on my brow will remind me that, apart from God, and God's life-giving Spirit, I am nothing but dust. But those ashes, in the sign of the cross, remind me of the promise that death is not the final word.

We are but dust. And to dust we shall return.

How we got here is this – we are sinners. Yes you are, and so am I. Sin is, at its core, separation from God. An image used often to describe it is an arrow missing its mark. Luther said it is like an arrow turned in on itself, symbolizing that the focus is on self and not God or others.

Sin is not living as God created us, not doing what God has commanded and/or DOING what God has commanded us NOT to do. And the wages of sin is death. We hear this in Genesis, right? Adam and Eve wanted to be something more than what God intended – they wanted to be just like God. God straightened them out on that, and death came to be a part of who we are.

It would be easy for us to say its not MY fault. NO! Its Adam and Eve's fault. It is my ancestors' fault. It is my parents' fault.

Lent is a time to face the fact that it is your fault. It is my fault. I am a sinner. So are you.

Sin and death - that is the problem. Jesus offers the solution. God tried with prophets and kings, but people kept falling back into self-serving, and God put on back burner, so to speak. Finally, God sent His Son to bring us back to a right relationship with God, and to reconnect us to God and one another.

Those ashes we scattered on the ground were the remnants of my parents' bodies. We give back to the earth the elements, with sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life. Through Jesus' death and

resurrection, we have hope, we have a promise, we have life!
Lent is our opportunity to return to God and walk in God's ways.
Let us pray: Gracious God, out of your love and mercy you breathed into dust the breath of life, creating us to serve you and our neighbors. Call forth our prayers and acts of kindness, and strengthen us to face our mortality with confidence in the mercy of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen


