

COVID Directions – The Next Steps

The good news is that things are getting better! Numbers of new cases are falling, and restrictions are being lifted in our communities, and we hope and pray things will get back to normal soon.

At Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, our two main principles guide us:

- To proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ in Word and Sacrament and carry out God's mission as God leads.
- To be mindful of the health and safety of all.

As we move forward to provide a safe environment for all, here is an updated guideline from the Health and Safety team, effective immediately.

- We encourage all who are not vaccinated to please wear a mask. This message will replace the 'Masks Required' signs
- We invite children forward for children's sermons and to play instruments with the same guidelines. We encourage parents to have their unvaccinated children use hand sanitizer after playing the instruments.
- We will return bulletins back to the 9 am and 11 am worship services.
- We will return the attendance pads, hymnals, and bibles back to the pews.
- We will take down the large COVID banners at the entrance.
- We will live stream the 9 am (contemporary) and 11 am (traditional) services. These services will be available on our YouTube page afterwards as well.
- Communion will be offered at the altar by Pastor Charlie and a communion assistant, both who are fully vaccinated. Directions on how this will flow will be made available in a video as well as morning announcements at worship.
- We will continue to offer individual pre-packaged cups for those who wish to commune using these.
- For groups meeting at the church, we encourage those who are not vaccinated to still wear masks.

Once again, the concern is not just for ourselves, but for our brothers and sisters in Christ.






The Smile of Love

Prince of Peace Lutheran Church is a loving and caring congregation. I know this because I have lived it both within our church walls and on the outside through the many missions we support. We don't always have a chance to directly see the effect our support has on others, but sometimes we get a glimpse. When we do, we should treasure those moments, because we are looking directly into their hearts.



A few years ago, I had the privilege of joining the board of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Cleveland Metro Area. We work with coaches and athletes to bring them the saving grace of Jesus Christ. We work in the high schools, the colleges and in our professional sports teams in the Cleveland area. You may or may not have noticed a bowling pin in the narthex. It is signed with about 15 names from our church. It represents Prince of Peace Lutheran Church's team at the 2019 FCA Fund Raiser where we financially supported this Christian focused group.

There are so many touching stories I could tell, but here is one that I was involved in. I will save some others for the future. In 2018 the Cleveland Area FCA was supporting the east side Glenville High School summer football camp. 70 high school football athletes were out on the field in the hot July sun working with the coaches on their fundamentals. I was standing with several FCA board members watching the workouts just waiting for lunch time when we would go inside the nearby church and break into groups of 10 that we call "Huddles." I was looking forward to leading a Huddle that day in prayer and a short bible study. As we watched the workout, a young teenager walked up.

Because of the stereotypes I carried, all I could think is that this kid was trouble, He said nothing, just stood there staring. Finally, one of the board members walked over and handed the young man a bible. He took it and wandered down onto the track area surrounding the field. We watched as he stretched out on a grassy area near the track and placed the open bible over his face to shield the sun. After about 10 minutes, he rolled over, and to our astonishment, he began to read. Just before the large group left the field for our lunch and bible study, I saw the teenager look up and smile. I never saw him again.

The next week at our FCA board meeting, the director, Steve Sanders, read to us a text he had received from that same teenager. I don't recall it word for word, but it was something like this: "Dear Mr. Sanders, Please thank the FCA member who gave me the bible. I now read it every day." Steve Sanders explained that the young man was the son of the leader of the largest gang on the East Side of Cleveland. Even though he was not an athlete, he hung out with them in the summer months so he didn't have to be at home, where his father conducted gang business.

I don't know the rest of the story, but I do know that for a moment we at the FCA touched a life which was in need of a life line. Through that simple smile we could see into the young man's heart. Steve stated that he was really a good kid, and it was only with the help of his friends, and now by the grace of God, that this young man would continue on this path.
