

#### **Carlson Boots and Socks for Christmas**






#### **SOAP Bible Study**

From PC's PC (Pastor Charlie's Personal Computer!)

Matthew 25:1-13

Jesus said, "Then the kingdom of heaven will be like this. Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. 2 Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. 3 When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them; 4 but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. 5 As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept. 6 But at midnight there was a shout, 'Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' 7 Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps. 8 The foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' 9 But the wise replied, 'No! there will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves.' 10 And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut. 11 Later the other bridesmaids came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' 12 But he replied, 'Truly I tell you, I do not know you.' 13 Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.

Candles and Christmas go together, don't they? Candlelight Christmas Eve services are a staple of our worship life. Jesus Christ, the Light of the World, comes to shine in the darkness – the light that no darkness can overcome.

I remember serving as an acolyte one Christmas Eve, given the charge to walk down the center aisle of the church and offer the flame to those in the pews with their individual candles in hand. I came to the pew where my three brothers and my parents sat. My loving brothers thought it would be funny to try to blow out my candle as I came by. Ah, such cherished memories!

But I digress.

The story of the bridesmaids speaks of waiting for the coming of the bridegroom, and our need to be prepared. I share two Advent hymns that focus on this passage.

The first is the hymn, "Rejoice, Rejoice, Believers." The lyrics were written by Laurentius Luarenti, son of Herr Lorenz, or Laurenti, a burgess of Husum, in Schleswig. He was born at Husum, June 8, 1660. He entered the University of Rostock in 1681, and after a year and a half spent there, went to Kiel to study music. In 1684 he was appointed cantor and director of the music at the cathedral church at Bremen.

I love the words and sense of anticipation of the coming joy of Christmas. Here are the lyrics from the Evangelical Lutheran Worship hymnal, #244. Rejoice, Rejoice, Believers

1 Rejoice, rejoice, believers, and let your lights appear; the evening is advancing, and darker night is near.
The bridegroom is arising

and soon is drawing nigh.

Up, pray and watch and wrestle;
at midnight comes the cry.

- 2 The watchers on the mountain proclaim the bridegroom near; go forth as he approaches with alleluias clear.
  The marriage feast is waiting; the gates wide open stand.
  Arise, O heirs of glory; the bridegroom is at hand.
- 3 The saints, who here in patience their cross and suff'rings bore, shall live and reign forever when sorrow is no more.

  Around the throne of glory the Lamb they shall behold; in triumph cast before him their diadems of gold.
- 4 Our hope and expectation,
  O Jesus, now appear;
  arise, O Sun so longed for,
  o'er this benighted sphere.
  With hearts and hands uplifted,
  we plead, O Lord, to see
  the day of earth's redemption
  that sets your people free!

## "Member Profile" This Week's Feature: Rachel Drobnak



Rachel Drobnak was born in Westlake, Ohio. She grew up with her parents Joan and Tom, with brothers Mark, and Brian in Olmsted Township. She was baptized and confirmed at POP. Attending Sunday School, performing in Christmas programs, and The Children's choir was important in her Faith Journey. Her Junior and Senior High School involvement in Band was a priority as participating in Marching, Concert, and Jazz Band along with Pit Orchestra and Baldwin Wallace Community Band was gratifying. After graduating from Olmsted Falls High School, she was accepted at Michigan State University to major in Crop and Soil Sciences. She also minors in Spanish and Environmental Studies and will graduate in May. Rachel plans to pursue her graduate degree in Crop and Soil Sciences at Michigan State University next fall, based out of a research station in Kalamazoo. This will fit in with her goal of responding to the needs of the environment. It has an effect on all citizens and knows this is how to make a difference.

She has been active in many groups and activities throughout her life. Much of her time away from her studies are focused on music, ministry and the outdoors. Rachel enjoys playing the piano, saxophone, and the bell tower carillon with an organ style keyboard used to produce beautiful music. Many members will also recall The Drobnak family performing at services over the years. She has worked in a cherry orchard, an agricultural research station, and as a teaching assistant among other positions. Hiking with friends through State Parks included a 20 mile, four day camping trip in the Upper Peninsula recently. Having a passion for Campus Ministry as a student leader started with her involvement at POP Youth events. Being active in the confirmation class here, attending Youth Gatherings and planning future events, and being elected President of the synod Lutheran Youth Organization while leading the 2020 Northeast Ohio Youth Gathering before Covid, gives her much to be proud of. Other projects are too numerous to mention here.

As a Campus Ministry Leader at MSU, Rachel attends a local Lutheran church with a focus on inclusion. Two full time pastors provide spiritual guidance. Although not directly funded by MSU, they have a robust program that has contributed to many important missions. Working with Habitat for Humanity, trips to underserved communities in South Carolina, regular Bible Study, and dinner Gatherings have worked well to spread The Good News!

Something that people may not know about Rachel is that she would like to forge a bond between Ohio and Michigan that is lacking. She wants to shut down any "Ohio Slander" when it is mentioned. The solution she offers is to be positive and show how both states are special in their own right. Visiting friends that return from an Ohio trip relate that Cleveland is an especially great city. It sounds like the effort is working




#### PoP Choir
