

COVID Directions – The Next Steps

The good news is that things are getting better! Numbers of new cases are falling, and restrictions are being lifted in our communities, and we hope and pray things will get back to normal soon.

At Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, our two main principles guide us:

- To proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ in Word and Sacrament and carry out God's mission as God leads.
- To be mindful of the health and safety of all.

As we move forward to provide a safe environment for all, here is an updated guideline from the Health and Safety team, effective immediately.

- We encourage all who are not vaccinated to please wear a mask. This message will replace the 'Masks Required' signs
- We invite children forward for children's sermons and to play instruments with the same guidelines. We encourage parents to have their unvaccinated children use hand sanitizer after playing the instruments.
- We will return bulletins back to the 9 am and 11 am worship services.
- We will return the attendance pads, hymnals, and bibles back to the pews.
- We will take down the large COVID banners at the entrance.
- We will live stream the 9 am (contemporary) and 11 am (traditional) services. These services will be available on our YouTube page afterwards as well.
- Communion will be offered at the altar by Pastor Charlie and a communion assistant, both who are fully vaccinated. Directions on how this will flow will be made available in a video as well as morning announcements at worship.
- We will continue to offer individual pre-packaged cups for those who wish to commune using these.
- For groups meeting at the church, we encourage those who are not vaccinated to still wear masks.

Once again, the concern is not just for ourselves, but for our brothers and sisters in Christ.



The Joy of Jesus

I have written before about the support of Prince of Peace for the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. I would like to tell you about another experience that I have had with this Christian group. In 2019 I again helped as a Huddle leader at Glenview High School summer football camp with the FCA. This time there were about 72 young athletes in attendance. There were also 22 of these young men who had never been baptized and had agreed to be baptized at the end of the camp in the Friendship Baptist church across the street from the practice field.



I was brought up in the Lutheran Church, and like many Lutherans and Catholics, I had never even seen an immersion baptism, except in the movies. Throughout the camp I was looking forward to being present and supporting these young men. The training went well, the Bible study Huddles went well, if not a little rowdy the first day. But three days of hot summer football practice will tend to calm even the most enthusiastic football players.

At the end of the third day of camp we all filed into the chairs set up in the fellowship hall of the Church. We all got cold bottled water and a snack. We listened to head coach Ted Ginn Sr. address the boys, who never fussed and paid strict attention, out of the tremendous respect they have for the coach. His message was that football was only temporary, and they all had a greater calling and purpose in life. The 22 young men were pulled from the room to be robed and instructed. We then filed into the church sanctuary where many of the families had already assembled.

The Pastor had a short message for the team and especially the 22 young men all robed in white. Then an Elder of the church spoke and presented the first young man by name for baptism. The Pastor then said the words, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit." As he did so, he raised his hand high into the air with the word, Father, and again with the word, Son, and again with the words Holy Spirit. The young man was then immersed in the baptismal pool. I looked around and saw everyone in the church, the families, the coaches and the rest of the team raising their hands high into the air right along with the Pastor. I was the only one not doing so. Where was my support? With the third young man, I too was raising my hand high into the air with each proclamation.

When all the young men had been Baptized, the service concluded and the young men were brought down to an area where we all greeted them. They were all smiling and filled with Joy. Their fellow teammates congratulated them, and their parents were so proud. They had made the decision to accept Jesus Christ as their savior, and now were the Lord's people. Will they fall away, especially in the neighborhoods of Cleveland's east side? I don't know for sure, but the answer is probably yes to greater and lesser extents. We all do. But, as a Christian, I know that the Lord will not give up on them. That's right, the Lord will never give up on them.

I drove home that evening thanking the Lord for allowing me to be a part of the FCA and thinking of the support that POP has given that allows them to accomplish the Lord's work. I was so excited that I started calling people and telling them all about this most wonderful day. Do our efforts and missions reach beyond our church walls? You bet they do! And the best news yet is that you can be an active part of our many missions and programs, and you too, can feel the love of Jesus.
