


SOAP Bible Study

James 3:13-18

Two Kinds of Wisdom

13 Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. 14 But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. 15 Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. 16 For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. 17 But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. 18 And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace.

The Wise Men brought gifts for the newborn king.

How wise were they to bring gifts of gold, incense, and myrrh? Formula and diapers would probably have been appreciated!

I remember a Far Side cartoon that said, "Not known by many, there was a fourth Wise Man who was turned away from the manger for bringing fruitcake!" (My apologies to you fruitcake lovers).

Can you imagine what it must have been like for the servant of the wise men to go shopping for these gifts?

Here is a skit I came across a few years ago:

STOREKEEPER: Now, sir, you're next. May I help you?

SERVANT: Yes, I need several things right away.

SERVANT: No. I would just like three ounces of myrrh if you have it.

STOREKEEPER: Well, we have it, but it really isn't very fitting if you ask me. You use myrrh to prepare a body for burial.

SERVANT: Look, I am in a bit of a hurry. Will you sell me the myrrh or not?

STOREKEEPER: Oh, certainly. Was there anything else?

SERVANT: I also need three ounces of gold dust, and three ounces of frankincense.

STOREKEEPER: For the baby?

SERVANT: Yes! You have it, don't you?

STOREKEEPER: Sure. But gold dust is usually reserved for royalty, and you use frankincense when you worship God in the temple. Are you sure you...

SERVANT: Yes, I am sure! Now, will you get them, please?

STOREKEEPER: Yes, sir, here you are. Say, that must be quite a baby!

SERVANT: That's what I hear. That's what I hear!

The wise men brought gifts for Jesus - gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Gold, because Jesus is king. Gold is a gift you give to a king! Frankincense, because he is God. Frankincense is incense used as an offering in worship. Myrrh because he is human. Myrrh is a spice used in preparing a body for burial. In these gifts, we see the wisdom of the Magi, who, in presenting these gifts, confess Jesus is Emmanuel, God with us, God in the flesh. He is completely God and completely man.

What gifts do you bring to the Christ child this day? May we offer all that we have and all that we are to the one who gives his life for you and for me!

Let us pray: Your foolishness is wiser than human wisdom. Thank you for the wise decision to send your son to save us. We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen.




PoP Choir


