September 2021 Health and Safety Update

Dear Members and Friends of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church:

We had the opportunity to meet with our Health and Safety Team on September 20th. We discussed the current issues surrounding the COVID19

Pandemic and the hopeful news that a vaccine will soon be available for children ages 5 to 11 years old. There is hope that we are heading in the right direction, even though it might not be as quickly as we had all hoped. Let's continue what we are doing, and we will get through this together.

We share again that our two guiding principles at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church remain the same:

- 1. To proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ in Word and Sacrament, carrying out God's mission as God leads.
- 2. To be mindful of the health and safety of all.

We continue to encourage the following:

- If you are able to do so, get vaccinated. We ask that all our volunteers and staff are vaccinated to ensure their health and well-being as well as those they serve. We encourage you to do the same.
- If a booster shot is recommended for you, consider that as another level of safety.
- Get a flu shot. Dave Covell suggests ANY time is a good time to get the flu shot. That being said, you may consider getting your shot in early November, as it will provide good defense against the flu during the holiday season and into the new year.
- Masks are recommended for the times we gather in close quarters with each other. That includes the sanctuary.

Invitation to Prayer

James 5:13-15

Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them



pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven.

On Sunday, September 26, we heard these words from the Epistle of James. I appreciate the invitation and encouragement to pray in all circumstances. This connects us to God and to those we love in a bond of compassion and care.

Starting later this month, we will be adding an opportunity for you to share aloud the names of those on your heart that you wish to lift in prayer. As I shared in the sermon on this passage, the intent is not to give a medical update or message or sermon, but simply an opportunity to speak the name or names you want to lift in prayer, if you so desire.

During the prayers, our prayer leader will list the names of those we have on our list at church, then say something like this: "... and those we now lift before you today aloud or in our hearts." The prayer leader will then pause and allow time for you to do just that.

Please note this is not a requirement! God hears what is spoken and what we lift silently as well.

For me, I have found comfort and peace in having an opportunity to do this in worship. I hope that you find it beneficial for you as well.

As a student, mother, preschool teacher, salesperson, manager, or whatever you do, you should continually look for people God places in your path with whom you can share the Gospel."
