


Ash Wednesday

Beginning on Wednesday, March 1st, we will gather for Soup and Study at noon in the Fellowship Hall through the season of Lent.

The video series "The Way" by Adam Hamilton will be our study focus for Lent. Pastor Charlie Woodward will lead the discussions.



If you ever make it to Jerusalem, a must-see site is the Western or Wailing Wall. The wall has stood for over 2000 years. The wall surrounded the Temple in Jesus' day. The Temple was the place where God dwelt. Seated on the Ark of the Covenant, the Temple was the place God resided. It is the closest that the Jewish community comes to the former Temple site.

Pilgrims from around the world come to the wall to pray. These old stones show their age, with many nooks and crevices from a couple

inches to several feet in size. These pilgrims often will bring written prayers and place them in crevices as an offering to God.

When we were visiting our exchange student in Germany, we visited his family's church Inside the doors, there was a table set up with bricks – a prayer wall for the church. I brought that idea home to us at Prince of Peace for Lent.

In the narthex, a table with a brick wall will greet you at the entrance of the sanctuary. Pieces of paper and pens will be there for you. Take time to write a prayer – joys and sorrows. At the end of Lent, we will take all these prayers and burn them in our fire pit outside – an offering to God. Pr. Charlie




SOAP Bible Study

We are starting a virtual LENDING CLOSET of assistive devices people may need to borrow when they become sick or injured. These include items like walkers, raised toilet seats, bedside commodes, wheelchairs, crutches, etc.

It will work like this. The office at POP will maintain a list of who has what available assistive devices to loan. A member in need will call the office for contact information and then reach out to the owner of the equipment. The borrower is responsible for picking up and returning the item to the owner. The owner of the equipment will then let the office know when the item is available again to loan.

IMPORTANT: We will NOT be storing any equipment at POP.

Identification stickers for the equipment will be sent to the owners once they are registered with the office This will make it easier to identify where the equipment needs to be returned once it is no longer needed. If you would have an assistive device you would like to lend, please contact the office at 440-871-5565. We are only registering equipment at this time. Watch for an announcement when we will start lending these items.

Isaiah 40:21-31
21Have you not known? Have you not heard?
Has it not been told you from the beginning?
Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth?
22It is he who sits above the circle of the earth,
and its inhabitants are like grasshoppers;
who stretches out the heavens like a curtain,
and spreads them like a tent to live in;
23who brings princes to naught,
and makes the rulers of the earth as nothing.

24Scarcely are they planted, scarcely sown, scarcely has their stem taken root in the earth, when he blows upon them, and they wither, and the tempest carries them off like stubble.

25To whom then will you compare me, or who is my equal? says the Holy One.
26Lift up your eyes on high and see:
Who created these?
He who brings out their host and numbers them, calling them all by name;
because he is great in strength, mighty in power, not one is missing.

27Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel,
"My way is hidden from the Lord,
and my right is disregarded by my God"?
28Have you not known? Have you not heard?
The Lord is the everlasting God,
the Creator of the ends of the earth.
He does not faint or grow weary;
his understanding is unsearchable.
29He gives power to the faint,
and strengthens the powerless.
30Even youths will faint and be weary,
and the young will fall exhausted;
31but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength,
they shall mount up with wings like eagles,
they shall run and not be weary,
they shall walk and not faint.

This chapter of Isaiah begins with these words – "Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God."

Chapter 40 marks the beginning of "Second Isaiah" – like the second book in a trilogy. The first 39 chapters tell of God's frustration with the people and the result of that frustration results in a period of exile in Babylon.

This next section starting in chapter 40 is the promise that God has not given up on them. The introduction of these verses states this good news – "The Judeans in exile have a good reason to be hopeful: the one who will bring them to freedom is the God who created the world, the God who subdues the rulers of the earth and gives strength to those who are weary."



Continued:

God reminds them of God's covenant and promises.

So, Harvey went home. He got out of his car and screamed, "Hon, what's for dinner?" Hearing no answer, he moved to the front door and opened it. "Hon, what's for dinner?" Still no response. Finally, he made his way through the house and stuck his head in the kitchen, and called, "Hon, what's for dinner?" Harvey's wife turned from the sink, looked him square in the eyes and said, "For the third time, we are having roast beef!"

Have you not heard?

Sometimes WE need reminded of God's promises. How often do we forget who God is, and whose we are. We forget how God has been faithful and brought us to where we are today. There are so many other voices we hear, it can be easy to tune out what God has to say to you and me.

Have you not heard?

Hear again the Good News – you are loved. You are forgiven. You are God's beloved!

Have you not heard?

Let us pray: Almighty God, you have us two ears and only one mouth for a reason. May we hear again the good news, and know that you don't come and go, but abide with us today and always. Thank you for today and the hope for tomorrow. We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen


