

Sign Up to Join Us for In-Person Worship Service ~ This Sunday, November 15, 2020

In this ever changing world we try our best to create a safe environment for all. Prince of Peace is following all health guidelines directed by our Governor and The Ohio Department of Health. *Cuyahoga County is unfortunately back in the Red Zone.* As the county continues to recover, the mask order placed on July 17th will still be in effect.

We understand that these times are hard and that many people have yet to feel comfortable being in a group setting, however for anyone who does feel comfortable returning, we hope to see you this **Sunday, November 15th** for our one, inperson service at 10:00 am. Our at-risk members are still encouraged to participate through digital worship until they are comfortable worshiping in-person. There will be a limited number of "family groups" in the sanctuary so we can maintain social-distancing (a family group is 1 to 5 people).

We have now been meeting together for 17 weeks. During the past few weeks we have continued to see an increase in attendance, however we still have not filled all of our reservation spots. We encourage you to continue signing up as you feel comfortable. And if the number of people wishing to attend exceeds the distancing layout, we will develop additional worship options. Please be flexible as we adapt to these new conditions.

As more is known about the health and safety considerations, we will adjust our worship opportunities. 1. Sit as a family group in areas marked "Seating Here". 2. Seating available for young families in narthex. 3. No singing. 4. Individual Communion Kits provided. 5. No nursery available. 6. As previously said, wear your mask please. Masks will be available from the ushers if you forget. 7. Arrive early so we can maintain social distancing before service. 8. Leave as a family group and exit to parking lot where you can socialize and maintain appropriate distance. ** As stated above, please remember that if you wish to socialize after worship, walk out to the parking lot to do so. We love seeing everyone come and worship together, however for the safety of everyone it is important to social distance and our Narthex does not provide proper spacing to do so. Thank you!**

RESERVATIONS: There are 19 family group spots on <u>SignUpGenius</u>. Sign-ups are available through Thursday, November 12 at 11:59 pm. A family group ranges from 1-5 people. If a family group has more than five, that family will need to reserve two different family group spots to cover their whole family. Please make sure to check that the date you are signing up for is **Sunday, November 15**. 1) Scroll down to date 11/15/2020. 2) Click the box that says "Sign Up", a check mark should indicate that it has been chosen. 3) Once box is marked, click "Submit and Sign Up" button 4) Fill in you First and Last name, and in the comment box with the number of people you plan to attend, and if you need specific seating due to hard of hearing/vision, or preference. 5) Once everything is filled in click "Sign Up Now".

*If you have any complications or questions please call the church office. If no one can pick up the phone at the time of your call, please leave a message and we will get back to you as soon as we can.

PHONE RESERVATIONS: For those who do not have access to a computer or smartphone there are five family group spots available for reservations by phone. To reserve your spot please call the office at (440) 871-5565. Please leave a voicemail with your groups first and last name, the total amount of people in your group, and your phone number (so we can call back and verify your reservation was received, or to let you know that all the call reservations have been filled).



You don't need to sign up or ask permission to use the box -- just take what you need, when you need it.

The box is located outside POP, near the wheelchair ramp on the church's west side. It currently has food items including canned chicken, peanut butter, soup, beans, and crackers. It also has some household cleaning supplies and personal hygiene items.

Politics, Money and Religion, for as long as I can remember, these were the 3 things you were to never discuss at the dinner table. That is, if you didn't grow up as a Pastor's daughter. Religion has always been a main discussion point at my family's dinner table. Whether it be relating to the sermon that week, something that happened at school, or how my brother, sister and I treated each other. I can't think of a time when it wasn't somehow brought up at my house. So I am sure you can imagine my surprise when I would go eat dinner at a friend's house, and then remember that religion isn't a normalized topic at the table.

To give you a little background of when religion was brought into my life, I was born right before my mom's final year at Seminary. I attended my first Seminary event when I was two weeks old, and then my first class at three weeks. As my mom was called to different churches I was pretty much stuck with her from every church event, local mission trip, and summer camp. Let's just say, I met more high schoolers during the first six years of my life than I did when I was actually in high school. Attending every one of these church events set the stage for my own faith journey.

The first time I ever remember feeling Jesus was when I was nine. I was at Camp WAPO (a large church summer camp) with a couple of my friends, and we were sitting at the evening outdoor service. It was completely dark outside, the grass was a little dewy, and a huge projector screened lyrics to a popular contemporary song up on the side of the dining hall. Hearing everyone around me sing, knowing I was surrounded by good friends and God, I felt still. My body

had a wave of goosebumps shiver over me and then I was calm. I had been to so many church camps with my mom when I was a kid, but in this moment, this was my moment with God. I had never felt anything like it.

About three years later my mom was called to a church an hour and half away. I was 12, and like most 12 year old's would be, I was not happy with this idea of leaving all of my childhood friends, the normalcy of my life, just so that she could work somewhere else. I began resenting my mom, and therefore resenting everything she was connected with, including the church. At this new church, I realized that even though I was physically there, I was never mentally there. I thought God had failed me. I was depressed, hating myself, hating school, hating my mom, and hating God. I felt that no one was there for me. I truly have never felt lonelier in my life.





Within the year I had moved to a much smaller school, made a few friends, switched to a different confirmation group, and finally started opening myself up to the idea of Jesus. As I continued on my faith journey, I started recognizing what brought me closer to him. The act of service. From service trips to volunteering around the building. I loved helping others and hearing their stories about life, and about their own relationship with the lord. It helped me reflect upon my own experience and all that I have to be thankful for.
