We have completed the Peace Pavilion and have absorbed some additional landscape costs within our budget. Our only remaining spend is interest related to our financing.






Peace Pavilion Capital Campaign Plus Status as of October 14, 2025

Deuteronomy 9:25-10:5 (This is Moses speaking)

25 Throughout the forty days and forty nights that I lay prostrate before the Lord when the Lord intended to destroy you, 26 I prayed to the Lord and said, "Lord God, do not destroy the people who are your very own possession, whom you redeemed in your greatness, whom you brought out of Egypt with a mighty hand. 27 Remember your servants, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; pay no attention to the stubbornness of this people, their wickedness and their sin, 28 otherwise the land from which you have brought us might say, 'Because the Lord was not able to bring them into the land that he promised them, and because he hated them, he has brought them out to let them die in the wilderness.' 29 For they are the people of your very own possession, whom you brought out by your great power and by your outstretched arm."

10 At that time the Lord said to me, "Carve out two tablets of stone like the former ones, and come up to me on the mountain, and make an ark of wood. 2 I will write on the tablets the words that were on the former tablets, which you smashed, and you shall put them in the ark." 3 So I made an ark of acacia wood, cut two tablets of stone like the former ones, and went up the mountain with the two tablets in my hand. 4 Then he wrote on the tablets the same words as before, the ten commandments that the Lord had spoken to you on the mountain out of the fire on the day of the assembly; and the Lord gave them to me. 5 So I turned and came down from the mountain, and put the tablets in the ark that I had made; and there they are, as the Lord commanded me.

So this is the second time God (Yahweh) gave the 10 commandments to Moses to share with God's people.

According to the biblical narrative the first set of tablets, inscribed by the finger of God, (Exodus 31:18) were smashed by Moses when he was enraged by the sight of the Children of Israel worshipping a golden calf (Exodus 32:19) and the second were later chiseled out by Moses and rewritten by God.

Moses pleads with Yahweh to spare the lives of the Children of Israel for turning away from Yahweh and making other gods to worship. Yahweh tells Moses to carve the stones and put them in an ark. You know this ark, yes? Harrison Ford went looking for it in "Raiders of the Lost Ark."

This ark will become the Throne of God. King David will dance before the ark as it brought into the City of David, also known as Jerusalem. David's Son will build a Temple for the ark so that God has a place to dwell.

Jesus takes the place of Moses as the one intercedes on our behalf and pleads our case before God. How many times have we turned our back on God and worshipped (placed our hope and trust and future) on something or someone else? How many times have we denied knowing who Jesus is? How often do we make excuses for not listening to the Spirit nudging us, tugging at us, nagging us to do something or NOT do something?

16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

17 "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. (John 3:16-17)

While we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

The good news is that we are forgiven. And the good news is that God is with us. The promised Holy Spirit calls us, gathers us, enlightens us and sanctifies us (makes us right and worthy). And where two or three are gathered in the name of God, God is present. God is with us!

No ark to be found to find God. God is the one who finds us.

Let us pray: Forgive me, Lord, for the golden calves I worship. Turn me once again to hear the good news of hope and life only you can give. We pray this in lesus' name. Amen.
