

Smart Ways to Give Before Year-End

As we approach the end of the calendar year, you can take advantage of several tax-smart giving options. Your support helps us provide the ministries here at Prince of Peace.

1. Give from Your IRA (Qualified Charitable Distribution)

If you are 70½ or older, you can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) directly from your IRA to Prince of Peace. A QCD counts toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). You pay no income tax on the amount transferred. You can give up to \$108,000 annually. Ask your IRA administrator to make the distribution directly to Prince of Peace and not directly to you.

2. Recommend a Grant from Your Donor-Advised Fund (DAF)

If you have a DAF through your financial institution or community foundation, you can recommend a grant to Prince of Peace. It's an easy, flexible way to support POP. You can make one-time or recurring gifts from your DAF. You may also name Prince of Peace as a beneficiary of your DAF to continue your legacy. Ask your fund advisor to direct your gift to Prince of Peace.

3. Gifts of Appreciated Stock

A gift of appreciated securities, such as stocks, bonds, or mutual funds, can provide meaningful support for POP's mission while offering significant tax benefits. You can avoid capital gains taxes on appreciated assets. You can deduct the fair market value of your gift. Prince of Peace receives the full value of your contribution. 1 Thessalonians 4:1-12

A Life Pleasing to God

4 Finally, brothers and sisters, we ask and urge you in the Lord Jesus that, as you learned from us how you ought to live and to please God (as, in fact, you are doing), you should do so more and more. 2 For you know what instructions we gave you through the Lord Jesus. 3 For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you abstain from fornication; 4 that each one of you know how to control your own body in holiness and honor, 5 not with lustful passion, like the Gentiles who do not know God; 6 that no one wrong or exploit a brother or sister in this matter, because the Lord is an avenger in all these things, just as we have already told you beforehand and solemnly warned you. 7 For God did not call us to impurity but in holiness. 8 Therefore whoever rejects this rejects not human authority but God, who also gives his Holy Spirit to you.

9 Now concerning love of the brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anyone write to you, for you yourselves have been taught by God to love one another; 10 and indeed you do love all the brothers and sisters throughout Macedonia. But we urge you, beloved, to do so more and more, 11 to aspire to live quietly, to mind your own affairs, and to work with your hands, as we directed you, 12 so that you may behave properly toward outsiders and be dependent on no one.

It sounds like good common sense, doesn't it? Live quietly, mind your own affairs, behave properly.

It sounds like fatherly advice.

Lattended a funeral for a family member a couple years ago. One of the man's sons shared a eulogy about his dad, who was a quiet man, a gentle man, a kind and quiet man. He shared that when he was a teenager, his dad would say to him as he headed out the door, "Act like somebody." He said he never really understood completely what Dad was saying until he got older and had kids of his own. He began to realize that what Dad meant was to live like someone who can be somebody for others. Treat others with respect. Honor your parents by how you live. Do the right thing. He said that he later found out this was a line that Andy Griffith would say to Opie (ask your grandparents!).

These words reminded me of the camp director I worked with when I was in college. He made sure that every time we had a day off (camp ran seven days a week so we had staggered days off), he asked us to stop in his office before we headed out for the day. He would ask us two questions — "What are you going to do today?" and "What are you wearing?" He knew that as soon as we left the camp property, we were representing the camp by our actions, good or bad. He wanted to know if we were wearing any shirts that proclaimed our place of employment. Whether we knew it or not, we reflected on the camp by what we were going to say and do.

Act like somebody who represents us well. I think that was the message the director was sharing.

Act like somebody. I believe God desires the same of us. Act like somebody who can be somebody for somebody else. Do we act like somebody who is a child of God?

Would you act differently if you had a sweatshirt that says "I am a child of God!"?

As someone once said, "You may be the only Bible your neighbor may ever read."

Something to ponder.

In response to what God has done and continues to do for you and me, let's act like somebody!

Let us Pray: Thank you God, for making me somebody special in your eyes. May we do our best to live up to your perception. We pray this in Jesus' name.
