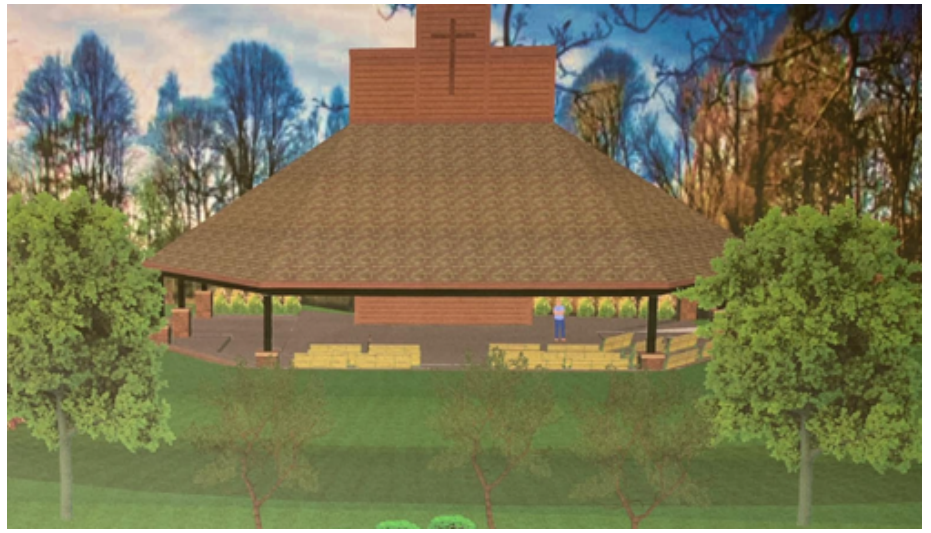

Goal = \$500,000

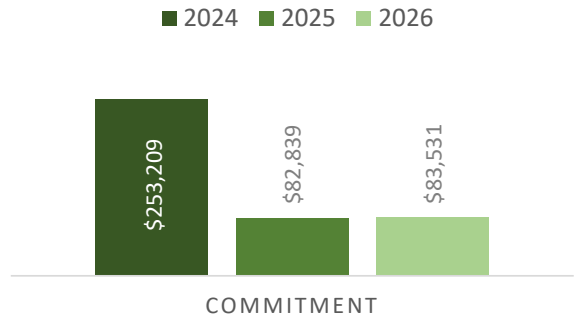

1 Peter 1:13-16 NRSV

A Call to Holy Living

13 Therefore prepare your minds for action; discipline yourselves; set all your hope on the grace that Jesus Christ will bring you when he is revealed. 14 Like obedient children, do not be conformed to the desires that you formerly had in ignorance. 15 Instead, as he who called you is holy, be holy yourselves in all your conduct; 16 for it is written, “You shall be holy, for I am holy.”

Christ is Risen!

He is Risen, Indeed! Alleluia!

A call to holy living. “Holy Living.” Sounds like a new magazine, like “Country Living” or “Urban Living.” What does that look like where you are today?

A simple definition I often use for the word, “Holy” is that which is set apart for God’s service. The Holy Bible is a collection of words gathered together for God’s service. Holy Communion is bread and wine set apart for God’s service.

In the waters of baptism, God named you and claimed you as God’s own. In the waters of baptism, the sinful self was put to death, and you were raised up to new life in Jesus Christ. In the waters of baptism, God’s promised Holy Spirit was bestowed on you, for you have marked with the cross of Christ and sealed with the Holy Spirit forever. In Holy Baptism (Water and Word set apart for God’s service), God has named you holy – set apart for God’s service.

Being named “holy” is not a “get out of jail free” card or a “look at me, how great I am” name tag. Being named holy is not a title given so that the focus is on me, but rather that the focus be on God. Being set apart for God’s service is so that the focus might be on GOD and not on me!

More than a title, I believe this is a command, and invitation to live our lives differently than what the world would have us live.

We are set free from trying to save ourselves and attempting to please God to earn God’s favor. God loved us while we were yet sinners, and sent God’s only son to die and to rise for you and me. We didn’t earn it. We don’t deserve it. We did nothing to get it.

It is a gift of pure grace. It is a gift of unconditional love.

In response, what is God calling you to do and to be?

How can God use you to let others and the world know about God? How is God calling you to live a holy life?

Are you ready to ask God to help in what that might look like in your life today?

Set apart. You are holy.

Christ is Risen. Risen Indeed – ALLELUIA and AMEN!

Let us pray:

Almighty God, you are holy. Guide to holy living. We pray this in the name of Jesus Christ, our Risen Savior. Amen.

## THIS WEEK'S PROFILE

Deb was born at Fort Knox Army Hospital in Fort Knox, Kentucky. Her father was serving in the U.S. Army at that time. Until sixth grade, her family lived very close to Cleveland Hopkins Airport. Then they moved to Olmsted Township and she attended Olmsted Falls Middle School and then the High School. Her parents still live in the same house. She has one brother who lives in Westlake. He and Deb's sister-in-law have three adult children. After high school she attended Ohio University. She graduated with a B.S. in Elementary Education. Deb served as a teacher at West Park Lutheran School for 18 years.

After those years, she went into management with Office Depot. When Office Depot left the area she returned to teaching. She taught kindergarten for 9 years at St. Mark Lutheran School, Brunswick, Ohio. During her teaching years she served on the PTL, directed Christmas Programs, wrote and directed an all school Spring Program, served as a mentor, and developed and managed an Extended Care Program for school age children. She currently works as an ABA tutor for children on the Autism Spectrum. Deb has the opportunity to work one on one with children from 18 months to 13 years old.

Deb is not a member of Prince of Peace but she does attend on a regular basis. She has been a member of Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Cleveland for more than 50 years! She has been involved in many ways at her home church. She served as Secretary of the Congregation, Sunday School Superintendent, and Chairperson of a variety of committees (too many to name). She wrote and directed several Christmas and Easter Programs for the Sunday School children. Deb currently serves on the Food Pantry Committee where approximately 70 families are served each month.

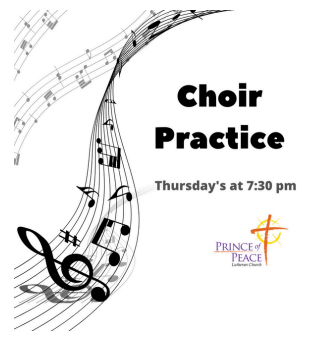

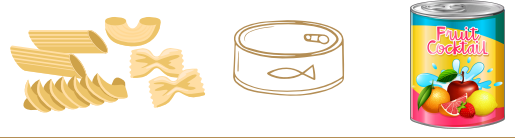
