

Sign Up to Join Us for In-Person Worship Service ~ This Sunday, September 27, 2020

Hello members of Prince of Peace.

In this ever changing world we try our best to create a safe environment for all. Prince of Peace is following all health guidelines directed by our Governor and The Ohio Department of Health. Cuyahoga County has dropped to the orange zone. As the county continues to recover, the mask order placed on July 17th will still be in effect.

We understand that these times are hard and that many people have yet to feel comfortable being in a group setting, however for anyone who does feel comfortable returning, we hope to see you this **Sunday, September 27th** for our one, in-person service at 10:00 am. Our at-risk members are still encouraged to participate through digital worship until they are comfortable worshiping in-person. There will be a limited number of "family groups" in the sanctuary so we can maintain social-distancing (a family group is 1 to 5 people).

We will not be singing in worship services. Individual communion kits will be offered before entering the Sanctuary. If the number of people wishing to attend exceeds the distancing layout, we will develop additional worship options. Please be flexible as we adapt to these new conditions. As more is known about the health and safety considerations, we will adjust our worship opportunities.

** As stated above, please remember that if you wish to socialize after worship, walk out to the parking lot to do so. We love seeing everyone come and worship together, however for the safety of everyone it is important to social distance and our Narthex does not provide proper spacing to do so. Thank you!**

RESERVATIONS: There are 19 family group spots on <u>SignUpGenius</u>. Sign-ups are available through Thursday, September 24 at 11:59 pm. A family group ranges from 1-5 people. If a family group has more than five, that family will need to reserve two different family group spots to cover their whole family. Please make sure to check that the date you are signing up for is September 27th. 1) Scroll down to date 09/27/2020. 2) Click the box that says "Sign Up", a check mark should indicate that it has been chosen. 3) Once box is marked, click "Submit and Sign Up" button 4) Fill in you First and Last name, and in the comment box with the number of people you plan to attend, and if you need specific seating due to hard of hearing/vision, or preference. 5) Once everything is filled in click "Sign Up Now".

Trinity Lutheran Seminary Grant Recipient, Morgan Walker

In late August the Endowment Committee sent a letter and a check for \$6,000 to Trinity Lutheran Seminary as a grant from the Benevolence Endowment (Seminary Scholarship) Fund for the 2020-2021 academic year to a student enrolled in their Master of Divinity program.

This fund was established and is being funded using 40% of the proceeds from the sale of the Saint Andrew property. Members, friends, and guests at Prince of Peace can also add to the fund to increase its value and future grants with current gifts, memorials, or estate gifts.

To the People of Prince of Peace Westlake:

I would like to extend my deepest thanks and gratitude to you on behalf of the scholarship I received through your Endowment Committee. Your support means so much and I am thrilled that God has brought us together for this time of ministry and development. I look forward to a time when we can gather in person and build further relationship. Until then, I am happy to share some of my background with you.

I grew up in Vermilion, Ohio and graduated from Vermilion High School in 2015. In May 2019, I completed my undergraduate studies at Capital University with a degree in Youth Ministry and Christian Education and a minor in Psychology. In my time at Capital, I worked in the Admission Office as an intern, was president of Capital's university-sponsored campus ministry, and studied abroad for a semester in Berlin, Germany during the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation. These were incredibly formative experiences and built a strong foundation for my seminary journey.

I am now in my second year at Trinity Lutheran Seminary in the Master of Divinity program, pursuing rostered leadership as a pastor in the ELCA. I am enjoying my time in the classroom, along with living in our intentional community on campus with two other classmates. Each week, we host our community common meal and work to create intentional community seminary-wide. In January, I spent two weeks on Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota with the Lakota people as a cultural immersion experience sponsored by the seminary. This summer,

I completed my Clinical Pastoral Education requirement and worked as a hospital chaplain in Michigan. While these experiences merely scratch the surface of my seminary journey thus far, they have been immensely rewarding and memorable. I have witnessed God's work in new and expansive ways, calling me to a career in ministry and to a vocation of lifelong learning.

Thank you for your commitment to sponsor seminary education. This support is a huge blessing to me and my colleagues as we live into the call God has placed on our lives. When you invest in students, you do not simply invest in an individual, but you invest in the future of the church. Thank you for your generosity and commitment. You are in my thoughts and prayers during this time as we continually seek God's presence in our world together.

Prince of Peace Blessing Box

Have you seen PoP's new Blessing Box? This is an emergency, self-serve FREE pantry, available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It's for anyone who has trouble buying things in a grocery store because of health or financial concerns. You don't need to sign up or ask permission to use the box -- just take what you need, when you need it.

The box is located outside POP, near the wheelchair ramp on the church's west side. It currently has food items including canned chicken, peanut butter, soup, beans, and crackers. It also has some household cleaning supplies and personal hygiene items.



POP members are encouraged to donate items in cans, boxes or plastic cartons. No perishables and no glass jars, please.

The box was created as an Eagle Scout project by Prince of Peace member [Nolan Gleespen], with assistance from Boy Scouts of Troop 208 and POP member John Cuciak.

I recently moved to a new house in Olmsted Township, and have been busy getting things organized, learning the area, and meeting new neighbors and their dogs. I meet new neighbors easily when I walk Corky, who is 16 years old. And, I spend time, almost every day, FaceTiming with my sisters and family.

I have not returned to church yet, and won't until I think it is safe to be in larger groups for an extended time. But I have tuned into the taped Sunday services. Although I live farther away from church, I will continue as a member of POP. I continue to sew and have been sewing masks



of various colors and designs. By the way, we are planning to resume the Quilters Group, because we usually have less than 10 gals present at any one time, and we can social distance easily as we spread out to work on quilts and fidget mats.

You ask, "How did I came to Christ?" Well, I grew up Catholic and had two cousins who were priests, and an aunt who was a nun. When I was younger, I thought all my non-Catholic friends were going to Hell, because that is what I was taught. I attended a Catholic girl's college, and taught in church, but I realize now that I did not have a relationship with Jesus; I had a relationship with the Catholic Church. When I prayed, the prayers were short and always memorized. But things started to change. I took a Comparative Religion Course and eventually met and married Byron, my husband, who was Lutheran. I have never had an "Aha Moment," that exact time when you know you have accepted Christ into your heart. But over the years I have definitely grown in my faith, and I now feel that God is close to me, always. And I have learned to pray openly and easily, which took some time. There was a time when Byron and I drifted away from the church, but we did rejoin, and I again feel at home with my Christian friends at POP.
