
### **Women In Transition**

### Can You Stretch Your String?

I heard a wonderful story and analogy the other day. The story was about an older man who attended a Christian workshop. The leader of one of the sessions picked the older fellow out of the group attending this particular session. He brought him up to the front. The man stated that he was attending the workshop because he wanted to become more involved in living his faith. The session leader asked him how old he was. The man responded that he was 75. The Leader then measured out a piece of twine that measured 100 feet long. He said, "Let's be optimistic and say that you will live to be 100. This length of twine represents your life."



He then cut off 75 feet and dropped it to the floor leaving 25 feet. "I cut this off since that is all behind you now," the leader said. "We spend about a third of our lives sleeping," and he proceeded to cut off another 8 to 9 feet. "We spend about 1 to 2 hours a day in the bathroom," and he cut off another foot and a half. "We spend time with our meals each day and we watch TV about 20% of our waking hours," and he cut off another 3 to 4 feet. "We spend time on our finances and family with shopping, just getting dressed and so forth," and he cut off another 4 feet. By the time he was done he had only a few inches left. The leader held up the few inches of twine for everyone to see, "This represents the time this man has left to become more involved in his faith."

The room was quiet. Everyone was applying this analogy to their own lives. You see, everyone at the workshop also wanted to be more active in their faith; that is why they were there in the first place. Believe it or not folks, this is not only a story of faith but of stewardship. It is a graphic story of how we use our time as Christians; and just what percentage of out time that really is.

As I heard this story, I too started to analyze my time and my life. How could I do more? How could I stretch this length of string that I have left to really be an active Christian? And then, I realized that I can stretch the string; that I can get more out of my time than just the time I have. I realized that I can do this by fulfilling my pledge, my POP commitment in 2022, and beyond, and even giving beyond my pledge. You see my friends, the dollars that we give reach way beyond what we are able to do by ourselves. They stretch the string! Your dollars help bring the message of the saving grace of Jesus to our members, our visitors and those watching on line. They help feed the hungry, they bring warm mittens and socks to needy kids, they help seminary students, they help bring warm, bright colored quilts to those in need.

Each of us has a different amount of string left, but only a small portion of that is available for the Lord's work. You can stretch that string. You can make a difference in people's lives.

### General Endowment Fund - Thank You!

A big THANK YOU from the Endowment Committee for your cash contributions to match our grants of up to \$2,500. These gifts allow us to share in the mission of these organizations during these continuing trying times.

Second Harvest Food Bank received \$2,645.05 from our members along with our grant for a total of \$5,145.05 being forwarded to them. Lutheran Metropolitan Ministry (LMM) received \$2,350 plus the fair market value of the boots, socks, etc. meeting our matching grant for a total of \$4,850 in checks being forwarded to them. Gifts made to our General Endowment Fund by our members enable us to make grants each year to worthwhile endeavors not in the church operating budget that are from 4% to 6% of the average of the funds last twelve quarters valuation.

In 2021 we committed grants of \$11,000. The Endowment Committee looks forward to making additional grants to help fulfill Christ's mission in 2022. Grant request forms can be found on the church website. Happy New Year!

### **December 2021 Health and Safety Update**

Dear Members and Friends of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church:

On December 9, our Health and Safety Team gathered once again together with council president and vice president Jim Dickey and Sally Balch. As has been our



practice, we discussed the current issues surrounding the COVID19 Pandemic. It is a confusing and difficult time right now. Vaccinations are available for more and more, as well as boosters. At the same time, another surge and variant arise.

With all this, we hold out hope that things will get better in the new year. Let's continue what we are doing, and we will get through this together.

We share again that our two guiding principles at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church remain the same:

- 1. To proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ in Word and Sacrament, carrying out God's mission as God leads.
- 2. To be mindful of the health and safety of all.

We will continue with our guidelines as listed below.

In addition to that, we will move forward on these two things:

- 1. Starting January 9, the nursery will be opened once again during worship services. All nursery attendants will be fully vaccinated and masked. Sanitation of the area will be done after each service, hand sanitizer, wipes and other cleaning items will be available.
- 2. The adult choir will begin again in January. The choir will be required to sing with masks for now, and all choir members must be fully vaccinated to participate. Singing masks will be provided to all participants.

While this is not back to normal, these are steps in the right direction.

We will continue to monitor the CDC guidelines, and we plan to meet again in January review where things stand in our community.

So for right now, things remain the same. We continue to encourage the following:

- If you are able to do so, get vaccinated. We ask that all our volunteers and staff are vaccinated to ensure their health and well-being as well as those they serve. We encourage you to do the same.
- If a booster shot is recommended for you, consider that as another level of safety.
- Get a flu shot. Dave Covell suggests ANY time is a good time to get the flu shot. That being said, you may consider getting your shot in early November, as it will provide good defense against the flu during the holiday season and into the new year.
- Masks are recommended for the times we gather in close quarters with each other. That includes the sanctuary.
- If you are sick, stay home!
- Online options are available for worship and many of the education offerings to provide participation remotely.
