
Coffee House &Open Mic



From PC's PC (Pastor Charlie's Personal Computer!)

Acts 2:14a, 36-41 NRSV

Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Let the entire house of Israel know with certainty that God has made him both Lord and Messiah, this Jesus whom you crucified."

Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and to the other apostles, "Brothers, what should we do?"

Peter said to them, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him."

And he testified with many other arguments and exhorted them, saying, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added.

Christ is Risen! He is Risen, Indeed! Alleluia!

I remember a sermon from decades ago, in which the pastor shared one of the greatest miracles recorded in the Bible is that the church came into being led by 11 followers of Jesus. These disciples who stumbled their way behind him, sometimes stood in his way, and on Good Friday were no where to be found. From this group, the church begins.

In the verses above, Simon Peter, who had a long history of foot in mouth disease, is filled with the Holy Spirit and preaches a fantastic sermon.

We heard a part of the sermon last two Sundays. You many want to go back and read all of Acts 2. And do you see the response? Some 3000 people baptized in one day! I hope Peter didn't have to carry them all down the aisle to introduce them to the church.

The church, filled with the Holy Spirit comes to life.

I wonder if the disciples ever sat around at night and said, "I miss the old days, when it was just a dozen of us. We knew everyone in our church, and things were quieter back then." Sometimes we yearn for the old days, the past, the way things used to be.

But just when the disciples wonder what the future may be, as they are still hunkered down in the upper room, God shows up. The Spirit blows. Incredible things happen! Nothing will be the same.

I am confident God's Spirit still blows, and incredible things will continue to happen. Even when we find ourselves hunkered down.

Tomorrow may not be the same as yesterday, but know this for sure – God shows up! The Spirit blows life into the church.

Blow Spirit, Blow!

Christ is Risen. Risen Indeed - ALLELUIA and AMEN!

Let us pray:

Almighty God, blow your life-giving Spirit into our lives and your church today. We pray this in the name of Jesus Christ, our Risen Savior. Amen.
