Prince of Peace Ministry of the Month ~ Habitat for Humanity

Every month, Prince of Peace will feature one of our engagement ministries. We will share information about the ministry and let you know how you can get involved. For the month of April, the first ministry to be lifted up is Habitat for Humanity.



At Greater Cleveland Habitat for Humanity, we build, repair and sell affordable homes to families with a 0% Interest mortgage. We also concentrate our work in focused communities so we can have a greater impact on helping revitalize neighborhoods.

Greater Cleveland Habitat for Humanity has joined with all of Ohio's 45 Habitat affiliates to call on the state of Ohio to invest \$25 million to help build, rehabilitate and preserve 1,000 homes. But we need your help! <u>ACT NOW!</u>

Cleveland has once again been named the poorest, largest city in the US. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, Cleveland is the poorest big city in America. Thirty percent of Cleveland residents live below the poverty level, and half earn less than \$20,000 per year.

The money raised at the Run/Walk/Mosey will fund the construction of 8 new homes on Shale Avenue. This is our rendering of the Shale homes. These are 4 bedrooms, 2 full bathrooms, and just over 1,300 square feet.

We are also starting a project on West 128th Street. It is a plot of land that was a long time ago, a school. We will be splitting it up into 5 lots. This will be very costly due to the water/sewer and utilities because it was one lot and will now be 5. Here is the rendering of these homes. These are 3 bedrooms, 1 ½ baths, and just over 1,800 square feet. These are ADA-compliant homes.

February 2022 Health and Safety Update

The Health and Safety Team met on February 26 to discuss the latest information from the CDC and reviewed our guiding principles.



On February 25, the CDC revised its guidelines regarding mask recommendations. Instead of basing mask recommendations solely on caseload, the guidance also will consider hospitalizations, current beds by COVID patients and hospital capacity.

In the past couple of weeks, the caseload and hospitalization numbers in our community have greatly improved, and based on this new guidance from CDC, our county and surrounding counties are communities where the CDC suggests masks be optional for gatherings.

Our two guiding principles at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church remain the same:

- 1. To proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ in Word and Sacrament, carrying out God's mission as God leads.
- 2. To be mindful of the health and safety of all.

Based on these factors, we are changing our congregational protocols to be "mask optional", effective immediately. Those who wish to remove their masks in the church, classes, meetings, and gatherings may do so; those who wish to keep them on may also do so. We have a wide range of risk tolerance and health needs in the congregation, and our aim is to provide as many options for people to participate as we can, both in person and virtually.

High priority ministries that include individuals who may have increased risk will continue to be supported by wearing masks. Communion servers and the pastor will wear masks during the distribution; nursery volunteers will wear masks.

We encourage the following:

- If you are sick, please stay home. Whether you suspect a cold or flu, COVID or something else, and you show symptoms, please stay home and work on getting well!
- If you test positive for COVID-19, please let us know. As members of the church family, we want to offer any support we can. As with any health information, we will keep your information confidential.
- If you were exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19, please consider wearing a mask to protect the possible spread to others.
- Be considerate of those who continue to wear masks. There are many reasons why masks are still the best option for many in our community.
- In all these things, we love one another through these challenging days!

Remember that worship is live streamed every Sunday at 9 am and 11 am on our YouTube Page, so that everyone can join in worship!

The pandemic has tested our patience and resilience, and we appreciate the ways in which the people, leadership, and staff of Prince of Peace have supported each other through the past two years.
