

Peace Garden Planting Party

We're having a planting party on Saturday, May 17 (weather permitting) or in case of rain, on Saturday, May 24 from 10 to 12 am. And you're invited!

Bring a plant from your own garden (from listed varieties below only, please) to plant, or donate \$15 per plant, and we'll provide and plant it for you in the Peace Garden (the areas around the Peace Pavilion, including the 2 curved beds, garage perimeter, west side of Pavilion, and woodland area behind the Pavilion).

We're looking for the following perennials to enhance our beds: Black/brown eyed-Susan, White and mixed color coneflower, Shasta daisy, liatris (blazing star), cardinal flower, creeping phlox, astilbe, spiderwort, fern, trillium, Jack in the Pulpit, and Solomon seal. These lovely native plants offer different bloom times, benefit and support wildlife (except deer!) and require little maintenance.

Sign up sheets for flower donations and/or planting are on the table in the Upper Narthex. Picture boards prepared by our own Master Gardener, Debra Stewart, show the plants that we're planting, and can be found in the Charter Room. Any questions? Beginning on Memorial Day, May 25th and continuing through September 7th, this will be our summer worship schedule.

8:30 AM - INSIDE

A short 30-minute communion service will be held each Sunday inside.

This gives people an opportunity to worship inside if it's too hot or they don't care to be outside or just want to get on with the day before it gets too late with the short worship service that will include communion every week.

Only the 8:30 am service will be broadcast online

10 AM - OUTSIDE

A 10 AM service will be held every week in the pavilion. The format will be the praise service one week and the traditional service the next week. Whoever is not responsible for the 10 AM service will be leading the 8:30 AM service music.

If the weather is too threatening, too hot or too cold, we will move inside for the 10 AM service.

Once a month, or more frequently, a potluck lunch to follow the 10 AM service.

COMBINED SERVICES -followed by a POTLUCK


wine alone (according to Martin Luther).

She attended schools in all three places and graduated from Rocky River High School. Joanie earned a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology at Ohio University. She has a younger sister Anne and a younger brother Jack.

Mark met Joanie, who was waitressing at the time, at the Grog Shop in the old Westgate Mall in Fairview Park. In August of this year, they will celebrate their 49th Wedding Anniversary. He's so thankful that the Lord has guided him into taking these life-changing classes.

Psalm 31:1-5; 15-16; 24

Prayer and Praise for Deliverance from Enemies To the leader. A Psalm of David.

1 In you, O Lord, I seek refuge; do not let me ever be put to shame; in your righteousness deliver me.

2 Incline your ear to me; rescue me speedily.

Be a rock of refuge for me, a strong fortress to save me.

3 You are indeed my rock and my fortress; for your name's sake lead me and guide me,

4 take me out of the net that is hidden for me, for you are my refuge.

5 Into your hand I commit my spirit; you have redeemed me, O Lord, faithful God.

15 My times are in your hand; deliver me from the hand of my enemies and persecutors.

16 Let your face shine upon your servant; save me in your steadfast love.

24 Be strong, and let your heart take courage, all you who wait for the Lord.

Christ is Risen!

He is Risen, Indeed! Alleluia!

The benediction we often use in worship includes those beautiful words: "The Lord make his face shine upon you." There is something about a smile that can bring light into the darkest places. My phone has a "face recognition" safety feature on it — to unlock the phone, I simply hold the phone up to my face, and it will recognize me and allow me to use its features. I have found recently that when I am wearing a mask to go shopping, the phone doesn't know who I am. I understand that I am not alone — Apple is working on figuring out how to make that feature more user-friendly to the masked consumers.

When have you experienced the face of God shining upon you?

Another factor in my phone's face recognition is that the phone has to facing me directly before I can be recognized.

I believe God's blessings are given to us every day, but there are times we aren't looking in the right places. It's often a matter of perspective.

A few examples:

- I can look outside and see the green grass growing and behold the beauty of new life in God's creations. OR I can look at that same grass and see it as a lawn that I need to mow and trim (maybe that is where the title "crab grass" came from?).
- I can listen to the laughter and the tears of my kids in the house and thank God they are healthy. OR I can complain that I can never be alone.
- I can enjoy some time of quiet and solitude and give thanks to God for some peace in my life. OR I can be frustrated by the loneliness of being alone.

Whatever situation in which we find ourselves, is there an opportunity, even a slight one, that God's face might shine upon us?

I would suggest the last verse of our psalm for today encompasses that - Be strong, and let your heart take courage, all you who wait for the Lord.

A retired pastor in a church I served many years ago always sat in the side balcony of the church at the end of the pew. I remember his posture when I pronounced the benediction each week — he would turn and face me directly, and he would hold out his arms, as if ready to embrace a loved one. He was ready to let God's face shine upon him.

An old hymn comes to mind:

Turn Your Eyes Upon Jesus, Turn your eyes upon Jesus

Look full in His wonderful face, And the things of earth will grow strangely dim

In the light of His glory and grace, Oh soul are you weary and troubled?

No light in the darkness you see? There's light for a look at the Savior

And life more abundant and free, His word shall not fail you, He promised

Believe Him and all will be well, Then go to a world that is dying

His perfect salvation to tell, Turn your eyes upon Jesus

Look full in His wonderful face, And the things of earth will grow strangely dim

In the light of His glory and grace, Christ is Risen. Risen Indeed — ALLELUIA and AMEN!


Let us pray:
