2 Peter 3:8-15a

8Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. 9The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance. 10But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed.

11Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be in leading lives of holiness and godliness, 12waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire? 13But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness is at home.

14Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish; 15aand regard the patience of our Lord as salvation.

The actress, Helen Hayes, told a story in her autobiography. It was Thanksgiving Day, and she was cooking her first turkey dinner for her family. Before serving it, she announced to her husband and son: "Now I know this is the first turkey I have ever cooked. If it isn't any good, I don't want anybody to say a word. We will just get up from the table, without comment, and go out to a restaurant to eat."

With that, she returned to the kitchen. When she returned to the dining room with the turkey on the platter, she found her husband and son seated at the table... WITH THEIR HATS AND COATS ON! Talk about confidence – they were confident it was going to be a trip to the restaurant for Thanksgiving!

At times, aren't we like that when it comes to our relationship with God? We have problems in our lives, burdens that weigh us down. We pray to God and ask God to lift the burdens from our shoulders. But no sooner do we give it up to God, that we shoulder it once again, and think God doesn't care — he hasn't heard our prayers, and certainly doesn't want to do anything about them.

In times like these, God seems distant – God's promises aren't for us, and this church stuff seems worthless. We wonder where God is in the midst of the turmoil of the world. In the crowds we find ourselves in this time of year, why do we feel so alone?

In the letter of 1st Peter, the Peter deals with pressing concerns regarding the final advent of Jesus, especially concerns that could arise over its apparent delay. The author of the letter calls on Christians to anticipate the promised coming of the Lord through conduct dedicated to God. Peter speaks words of confidence to us when we are impatient, and unsure of God's presence and power in our lives. Peter writes, "the Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you!" He continues, "... in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and new earth, where righteousness is at home."

As we prepare, may we do so in confidence. Confident our relationship with God is strong and founded firm on Gospel of Jesus Christ. We are confident that:

Our sins are forgiven

We are loved

We belong to God

Christ has died, Christ is Risen, Christ will come again!

God promises – and God always keeps his promises!

Let us Pray: Good and gracious God, when we waver and wonder and wander, grant us your sure and certain confidence that we belong to you and you will never let us go. Amen, Come Lord Jesus!


Year End Giving
